



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the fourteenth day of March 1735 Surveyed unto Bastian Simerman a tract of Land situate in Westtown in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a post in a line of Jacob Levan's Land thence by the same South forty Degrees East eighty nine perches and by Vacant Land the same Course seven teen perches to a Chestnut Oak thence by Vacant Land North fifty degrees East one hun dred and sixty perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North forty degrees west one hundred and six perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South fifty degrees west one hundred and sixty perches to the place of Beginning Containing one Hundred acres with the usual allowance of six per cent
