



By Virtue of a Warrant from ye Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing date the <sup>18<sup>th</sup> of February</sup> ~~first~~ day of March  
 1738 I have surveyd and laid out unto ~~Andrew Cook~~ <sup>Adam Read</sup> in the Township of Hopewell in  
 the County of Lancaster on the West Side Susquehanna River Three hundred and twenty one  
 ac<sup>s</sup> of Land w<sup>th</sup> usual allow. Beginning at a Hickery by Conocochege Creek a Corner of  
 Robert Blacks= Land thence by the s<sup>d</sup> Land north sixty Degrees Easterly Three hundred and  
 twenty perches to a Hickery thence north thirty Degrees Westerly one hundred and sixty  
 perches to a White Oak thence south sixty Degrees Westerly Three hundred and sixty two  
 perches to a Hickery by the s<sup>d</sup> Creek thence Down the same Traversing the severall Courses  
 thereof near about one hundred & sixty seven perches to the place of Beginning surveyd  
 May 14<sup>th</sup> / 1738

 upon hearing the Case its adjudged that Adam Read shall have this land
