



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twenty seventh day of February 1733 conveyed unto John Brown a Certain Tract of Land Situate in Oley in the County of Philad: Beginning at a white oak in line of John Houshaers Land thence by the same North twenty Degrees West one hundred and twelve perches and by Vacant Land the same Course Twenty eight perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North seventy Degrees East one hundred & eighty two perches to a Black Oak thence by Vacant Land South twenty Degrees East one hundred and forty perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South seventy Degrees West one hundred & eighty two perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred and fifty acres with the usual allowance of six p. Cent
