



Surveyed on the twenty first day of March 1735 to Adam Mearns a tract of land situate in the Township of Salford in the County of Philadelphia beginning at a corner post on the east side of Perkiomine Creek thence by Vacant land North East Two hundred and thirteen perches to a post thence by land of Jacob Keller South East seventy perches to a post thence by land of Michael Boyher South West Twenty three perches to a post thence by y^e s^r Michael Boyher's land South East seventy perches to a corner or post of Rudolph Draugh's land thence by y^e same South West one hundred and Twenty one perches to a white Oak in the line of the s^r Draugh's land thence by the same North West Twenty four perches to y^e s^r Creek thence up y^e same to y^e place of Beginning Containing one Hundred and Seventy six acres with usual allowance
