



This tract of land surveyed by virtue of an order of court James Steel to me directed bearing date the 30<sup>th</sup> of the 6 month 1736 Beginning at a whit oak being the corner of John Bidcocks land thence north two hundred seventy six perches to a post and stone by the said Bidcock land and vacant land then west one hundred and sixty perches by vacant land to another post and stone then south one hundred and twelve perches to a small Osh by vacant and William black frans land then east one hundred and twenty perches by Jeffrey Burgas land to a post or stone then south one hundred and sixty five perches by the said Burgas land to a post then east forty one perches by the London Company's land to the place of beginning containing one hundred and fifty <sup>three acres and eighty</sup> ~~and one hundred and ten~~ perches of land lying in the upper part of the manor of high lands in Bucks County surveyed on the 12 day of the 6 month in the year 1736 by me to Thomas Reoss
