



By order of the Proprietary Surveyed to John Galbreath on the Eighth Day of April Anno Domini 1736 a Tract of Land in Donegal Township Lancaster County, according to the above protracted figure Beginning at a white oak a corner of William Mitchels Land thence South 52 degs East 90 ps to a Black Oak South 33 degs East 60 ps to a Black oak North Sixty Six Degs East 270 ps to a post N^o 34 degs west 11 ps to a Black Oak North 10 degs west 116 ps to a hickory South Sixty Six Degs west 233 ps to a hickory N. 24 de. west 15 ps to a white oak South 66 Degs west 115 ps. to Beginning Containing Two Hundred twenty seven acres & the usual allowance of Six p^{ts}. for Roads &c.
