



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the first day of June 1734 Surveyed unto Owen Rowland a tract of Land Situate in New Britain in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of Jeremiah Langhorne Land thence by Land of Lewis Evans South west Two hundred and forty four perches and by Vacant Land the same Course thirty nine perches to a Corner Stone thence by Land of Thomas Jones South East one hundred and Twenty perches to a white oak sapling in the line of Joseph Kirkbride's Land thence by the same North East two hundred & eighty three perches to a Corner Stone in the said Langhorne's Land thence by the same North West one hundred and twenty perches to the place of Beginning containing Two hundred acres with the usual allowance of Six plant.
