



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 27 day of March, 1738, surveyed on the 20th day of March 1738/9 To Thomas Renicks a Tract of Land Situate in the Township of Paxton in the County of Lancaster. Beginning at a Mulberry Tree thence North 44 Degrees East 360 p^{ts} to a post, thence South 54 degrees east 90 p^{ts} to a Chestnut Tree, thence South 86 p^{ts} Black Oak. (Alexander Stephen corner) thence South 39 degrees West 289 p^{ts} to a Hickory standing by Susquehanna River side thence up y^e said River by its several courses 175 p^{ts} to the place of beginning containing Three Hundred twenty six acres and the allowance of six acres for Cent for Roads and High Ways.
