



By Virtue of a warrant from the Proprietaries. Bearing Date the 14<sup>th</sup> day of March A. D. 1737. Surveyed - - - a tract of land in the Township of Hempfield & County of Lancaster. Beginning at a post in the line of Phillip No. 1's Land thence west by south 129 paces to a Black Oak thence South by East 140 paces to a post thence South South East 124 paces to a Black Oak thence East by South 48 paces to a Hickory thence North East 110 paces to a Maple, thence North 24 paces to a white oak thence North 56 deg west 106 paces to a Hickory thence North by West 57 paces to a Black Oak thence North 77 paces to the place of beginning. Containing Two hundred & thirty two acres with the usual allowance of 1/2 ft each
