



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in the Manor of Springtown in the County of Chester,  
now in the possession of James Beatty. Beginning at a Blazed Black oak ~~marked~~  
and from thence easterly by John Hamilton's Land. South, thirty eight degrees  
West fifty seven perches to a marked Hickory, thence by Thomas Scott's Land  
North eighty six Degrees East Two hundred and sixty eight perches to a marked  
Hickory, in a line of the said Manors thence by the same North  
twenty five degrees west twenty six perches to a Blazed Black oak,  
and west two hundred and twenty perches to the place of beginning. Con-  
taining forty seven acres and seventy perches and the usual allowance  
of six acres of Land for Roads & Highways, surveyed the sixth of October  
1753. by Order of the Noble the Proprietaries
