



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries bearing Date the Twentieth Day of March last past I have surveyed and laid out unto Edward Shippen Merchant in the Township of Copewell in the County of Lancaster on the west side of Susquehanna River four hundred and four acres of Land with allowance of 6 1/2 Cent. Beginning at a hickery in a line of other Land of the s<sup>d</sup> Shippen's Thence South forty Degrees Easterly Sixty five perches to a Hickery Thence South <sup>eight</sup> Sixty Degrees Easterly one hundred seventy eight perches to a Black Oak Thence North forty Degrees Easterly one hundred fifty eight perches to a Hickery Thence North forty Degrees Westerly Three hundred and twenty perches to a white oak Thence South fifty Degrees Westerly one hundred and ninety three perches to a White Oak Thence South forty Degrees Easterly one hundred and twenty six perches and three quarters to a post Thence South fifty Degrees Westerly forty six perches to the place of Beginning.
