



By Virtue of a warrant from the Honble Proprietaries Bearing Date the 29th Day of December Anno Dom 1736 Surveyed to Edward Dismont a Tract of Land lying within the Manor of Conestoga Beginning at a Locust Tree Being a Corner of the Manor Line thence Down Susquehanna River 81 perches to the mouth of a small Run called Mill Creek thence up the several Courses of the s^e Run 272 perches to a post thence North by West 84 perches to a hickory thence West by South 213 perches to the place of Beginning Containing One Hundred & twenty acres of Land without the usual allowance of six acres per Cent for road &c Surveyed the 29th of April an^o Dom 1740
