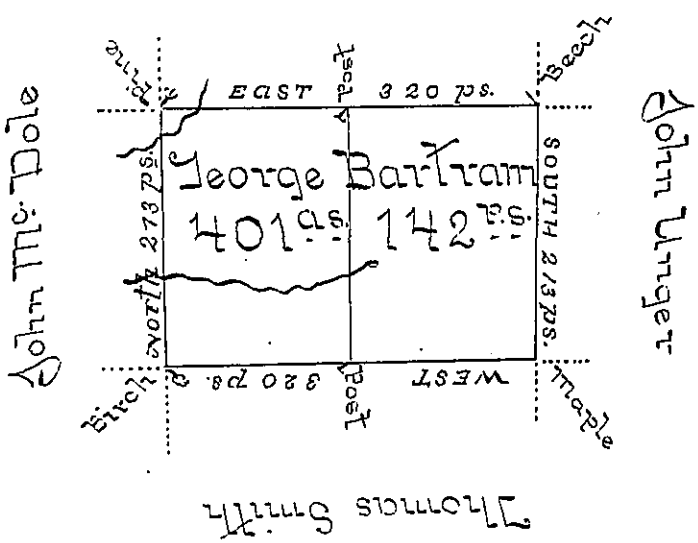

In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the 30th day of May A.D. 1792 granted to George Bartram was surveyed on the 18th day of November 1817 The above described tract of land containing 401 acres 142 Perches and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. situate in Followfield Township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, Abraham Jackson was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upward of ten acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided as above stated, between said Jackson & Joseph Clark.
