



The outside black & dotted lines, and Creek embrace the whole of a tract of land called Mulberry hill, surveyed for Michael Marshall Town^{4th} 1769, on his Order No. 3625, dated July 8th 1769. That part within the black lines is owned by William Quail, and contains two hundred and twenty nine acres & 29 perches & allowance and was ^{re} surveyed & returned to the Land Office in two separate surveys by W^m V. Sack Esq. for W^m Quail. The balance of the tract is owned by James Orr & Daniel Moore, as represented by the dotted lines & the Creek, and both of them have been ^{re} surveyed and returned to the Land Office by me, as Orr & Moores parts have been surveyed by me, since W^m Sack surveyed Quails, and we find some difference in the lines, W^m Quail requested me to make out a draught for him embracing all his unpatented land and agreeing with Orrs & Moores lines so as to enable him to obtain a Patent for the whole
