



By virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing Date the Day of \_\_\_\_\_ Anno Dom<sup>ini</sup> 1773. I have surveyed and laid out unto David Alexander in the Township of Bellevue in the County of Lancaster on the West side of Bellevue 662 2/3 acres of Land with allowance of 6 1/2 Cent. Beginning at A Black Oak standing by Muddy Lick Run, Thence North one hundred and twenty one perches to a Red Oak. Thence North Thirty five degrees Easterly seventy six perches to a Red Oak. Thence south fifty five degree Easterly Two hundred and twenty seven perches to a post, Then South Thirty five degrees westery one hundred and seventy five perches to a post a Corner of Thomas Evans Land. Thence by the S<sup>d</sup> Land North fifty five degrees Westery Two hundred and Eighteen perches to a Elm tree standing by the sd<sup>d</sup> run, Thence up the same, Traversing the several courses hereof near about fifty perches To the place of Beginning.
