



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietors dated the _____ Day of _____ Anno Domini 1735. There is Survey unto James Saw one hundred and seventy one acres of Land with allowance of six per cent in Lancaster County on the west side of Susquehanna River and begins at a Hickory by Conecogwanett Creek a corner of William Market Land. Thence south Eight Degrees Easterly one hundred ninety five perches to a white oak. Thence north fifty three degrees westerly Two hundred and thirty eight perches to a Hickory Thence north eighty Degrees westerly one hundred and forty four perches to a Walnut by the Creek Then Traversing down the same of severall courses there of about Two hundred and ten perches to the place of Beginning. Surveyed December 1st / 1735
