



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Thirtieth Day of August 1738 for Surveying unto George Baschair 150 Acres of Land on Suetara adjoining Christopher Stump's Land in the County of Lancaster I surveyed a Tract of Land situate on a Branch of Suetara Creek in the said County Beginning at a black Oak Saplin at a Corner of Christopher Stump's Land Thence extending by the same South 87 Deg^s East 100 pches Thence by vacant Land North 80 Deg^s East 123 pches to a post Thence by John Gnoff's Land North 20 Deg^s 188 pches to a White Oak Thence by vacant Land South 70 Deg^s West 197 pches to a White Oak Saplin & South 10 Deg^s West 59 pches to a black oak Thence by the s^d Stump's Land South 30 Deg^s East 78 pches to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred & eight acres & half an acre with the allowance of 6 p Ct for Roads &c Survey'd Sept^r 1738
