



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Ninth day of February Anno Dom: 1737 Survey'd unto Joseph Baker on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of April then next ensuing A Certain Tract of Land Situate on Doe Run (a branch of Brandwine Creek) in Marlborough Township in Chester County Beginning at a Hickory Tree at a corner of Jacob Taylor's Land thence West by the same Sixty-one perches & a half to a post thence South by the Land of Robert Burns 122 perches to a Hickory thence East by the Land of Robert Gabby forty six perches and a half to a post thence South by the same Land 66 perches to a post thence East by Jacob Taylor's Land fifteen perches to a post thence North by the Land of John Taylor and the land of the sd Joseph Baker one hundred & Eighty perches to the place of Beginning Containing fifty acres and the usual allowance for Roads
