



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the second of February Anno Dom^o 1737 I have Surveyed and Laid out unto William Bayley in the Township of Pennsborough in the County of Lancaster on the West Side Susquehanna River Two hundred and Sixty Six acres of Land with allowance of 6 p Cent Beginning at a White-Oak Thence North Twenty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and forty Perches to a Spanish Oak a Corner of Wm^o Cooper's Land Thence North Seventy Degrees Westerly One hundred fifty & six perches to a White-Oak Thence South Twenty Degrees Westerly Three hundred and forty ~~perches~~ perches to a Chestnut a Corner of Robert Mill's Land Thence North Seventy seven Degrees Easterly One hundred & sixty eight perches to the place of Beginning - Surveyed March 27th 1738
