



Sir: the above figure Contains the Improvement late of John Ocain which I survey'd for Samuel Burge of the City of Philad<sup>a</sup> by Virtue of Two Warrants now in my hands, the one of 50<sup>ac</sup> granted to John Ocain or his Heirs, the other to M<sup>r</sup> (obl.) but I think not Located on this Land, at the time of Survey, I understood the persons in trust for Ocain were willing that Sam<sup>l</sup> Burge should have the whole Land in Consideration for a Certain Debt, how that matter stands at present between the parties, I know not, only that Ocain's Brother lately told me he wou'd keep the Land and pay Mr. Burge — M<sup>r</sup> Burge lately wrote (obl.) to return the Land in Separate Draughts in Order to this (obl.) of y<sup>e</sup> Trapezia H containing 150<sup>ac</sup> & y<sup>e</sup> Usual allowance (obl.) prick'd lines 2° 45' W. 272 perches but am of Opinion it contains too much with the Improvements made by Ocain, (obl.) as Mr. Burge is present with you, who Doubtless will give you a genuine acct of the matter, I thought it best to submit (obl.) Seperating of the Draught, and the Manner how, to y<sup>e</sup> Se (obl.) Carlisle, I am Sir your most Humb<sup>l</sup> Serv<sup>t</sup>, March, 1753.
