The Draught of a tract of Land Called *James Purdy* situate on Lost Creek in the County of Cumberland containing Two hundred Nine Acres, 114 Perches with the usual Allowance of Six acres & Cent for Roads; survey'd the 19th. day of May Anno Dom. 1767. In Pursuance of a warrant from the Honble the Proprietaries to James Purdy dated at Philad^a the 6th. of September Anno. Dom. 1765 and cut out off, and taken from an old Survey made for Smith & Buchanan, agreeable to the Determination of the Board of Property of Monday the 27th. of April, 1767 (Purdy v. Smith & Buchanan)

N.B. Only 200 Acres of Smith and Buchanan's Survey was decreed to James Purdy, But there is contained in the above Return adjoyn^d Henderson, where the dotted line is, some Land which never was included in Smith & Buchanan's Survey, which was given to James Purdy by Wm. Henderson; of course this Return contains more than 200. If no Copy has ever been given of Smith & Buchanan's Return, I think it would be well to send it up to me, to be amended, if a copy has gone out of the office, a note of its being interfered with, can easily be put into it.
