



By Virtue of a warrant from ye Proprietaries dated the 26th day of October Anno Dom: 1737 Surveyed on the 20th. day of February Anno Dom: 1739 To John Carson A Tract of Land Scituate in Township of Pennsbury in ye County of Lancast^r: Begining at William Mortens Corner white oak Standing by ye River Susquehanna thence up ye said river by its Severael Courses 260 \varnothing^s : thence north 80 degrees west 125 \varnothing^s . to a Chesnut oak thence South 80 Degrees west 120 \varnothing^s . to a post thence South 29 Degrees west 149 \varnothing^s . to a post ~~thence~~ in said Mortens head line thence along ye said line north 49 Degrees East 120 \varnothing^s . being Mortens Corner thence Down the said Morten Line, South 41 degrees East 176 \varnothing^s . to a ^(obl) white oak the place of begining Containing 260 Acres and the Allowance of Six acres \varnothing Cent. for Roads & highways. Surveyed \varnothing^r Edward Smout.
