Called the Rich Land (formerly Cumberland) now Bedford County, Containing 457 & a half acres with the allowance of six ps Cent. for Roads & Surveyed by Richard Tea May 20th, 1785 (Six) Resurveyed September 18th, 1797 on Warrante granted to Thomas Fitzsimons Dated June 32, 1763.
