



Surveyed to George Messersmith on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of July 1784 the Above Described Tract of land containing two hundred and Eighty four Acres And One hundred and thirty three perches with the Allowance of Six p<sup>r</sup> C<sup>t</sup> & Situated and lying on a Branch of Coneimah Creek which Emptys into Said Creek on the South Side About two Miles from lands of Hugh Rogers, Adjoining Lands of Sebastion Graff, Benjamin Evans, Mathies Slough, William Branthwaite and Philip Dean in Bedford County, by Warrant of the 10<sup>th</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1773.
