



A Draught of a Tract of Land Called "Spring Path" Situate on the East Side of the North East Branch of Susquehanna River on both sides of the Indian path leading from Tunkhannock to Wyaloosing adjoining land surveyed for John De France & others in the County of North<sup>d</sup>. Containing three hundred ~~one~~ ~~Acres~~ & a half Acres besides the usual Allowance of Six & Cent for Roads &<sup>th</sup> Surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October 1774. for Jacob Hosterman. In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the 4<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1773.
