



A Draught of a Tract of Land Called Hughes Addition Situate on a Branch of Catawissey On the South side of Catawissey Creek adjoining land Surveyed for William Henry in the County of Northumberland. Containing Seventy Two Acres and a half, besides the usual Allowance of Six & Cent for Roads &<sup>ts</sup>. Surveyed the 27<sup>th</sup> day of March 1775 for Job Hughes. In Pursuance of a Warrant dated the 11<sup>th</sup> day of November 1774.
