



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the - day of - Anno Dom/17 -
 I have survey'de and Laid Out unto Allen Killough in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster On the West side - Susquehanna river. One hundred and Seventy Acres of Land with the Allowance of Six & Cente. In two peices One of Which Begins at a Chestnut Oake Thence North Eighty five Degrees Easterly One hundred and Eighty two perches to a White Oake. Thence South five Degrees Easterly one hundred and forty perches to a Post Thence South Eighty Degrees Westerly One hundred & Eighty two Perches to a White Oake. Thence North five Degrees Westerly one hundred and forty perches to the place of Beginning. The other Begins at a white Oake Thence South Twenty Seven Degrees Westerly One hundred and twenty two perches to a Post. Thence North Sixty three Degrees Westerly Twenty two perches to a Stone. Thence North four Degrees Easterly Ninty Perches to a White Oake. Thence North Eighty two Degrees and an half Easterly Sixty Nine perches to the place of Beginning.
