



A draught of a tract of land called the Elk Pasture (being part of a larger tract of the same name) situated between the North & East branches of Otter Creek or Conemough including part of the East Branch about three miles above the forks & about half a mile easterly from the great Elk Lick adjoining land of Benjamin Sheerman, William Robinson and Isaac Glaves in Frankstown township in the County of Bedford containing three hundred & nineteen acres and the usual allowance of six ~~per~~ cent. for roads &c. Surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1773 for Benjamin Sheerman by virtue of a warrant dated the 23<sup>d</sup> day of July in the same year, by
