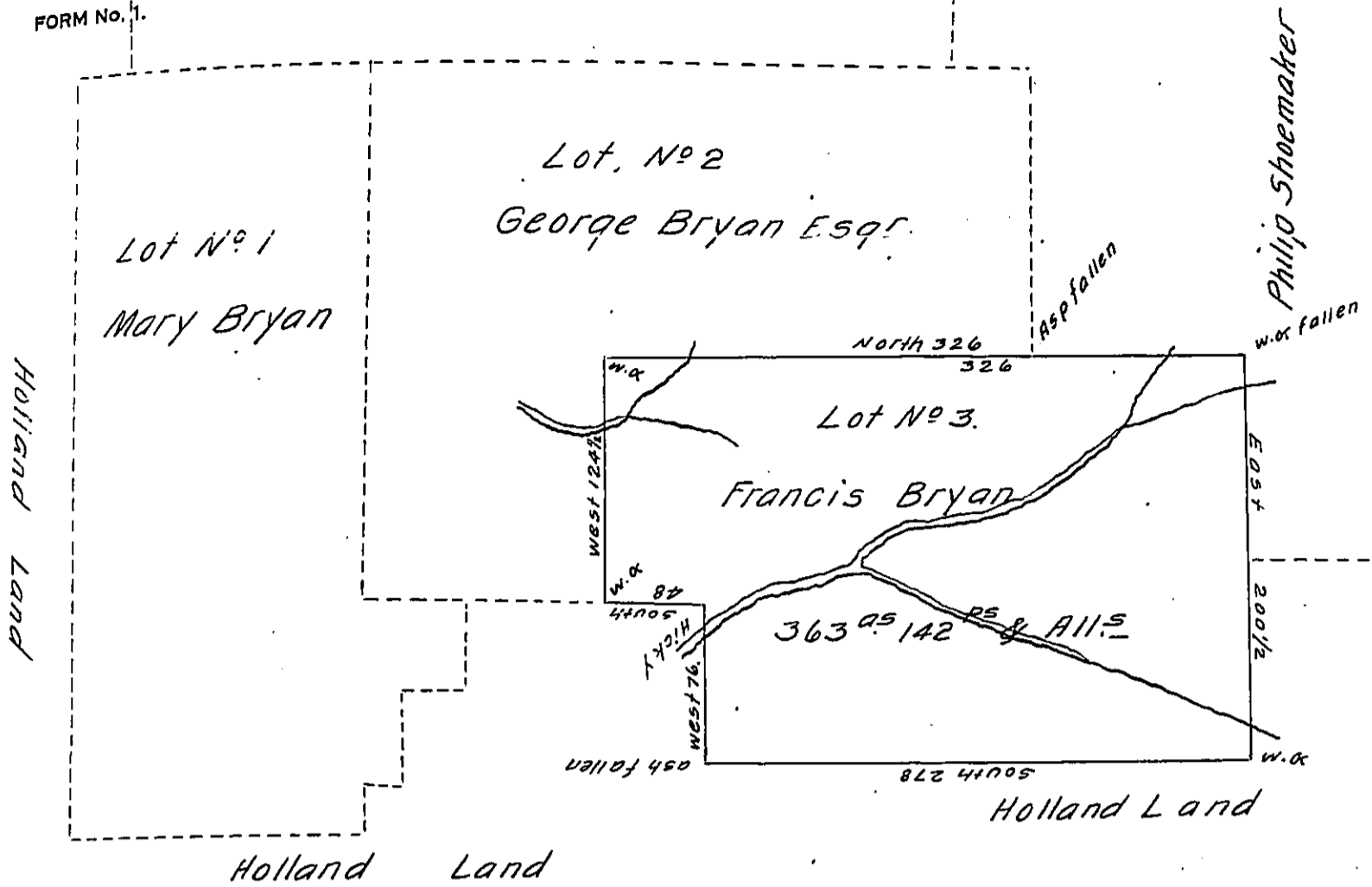

Therefore And Conformable to the foregoing ~~was~~ Surveyed to Francis Bryan on the 5th day of August 1825 the above described tract of land, containing three hundred and sixty three Acres, one hundred and forty two perches And Allowance of six p^r Cent & C. being lot N^o 3. the North east part of A larger tract Surveyed in pursuance of A Warrant granted to Arthur Bryan dated 20th of Oct^r 1785 And Numbered 685. Situate Adjoining lands of Edwd Bleakneys heirs. Philip Shoemaker and others. on the Waters of Mahoning Creek. Red bank township Armstrong County
