Situated on the Old Road leading from Bedford to Fort Pitt between Quemahoning Creek and Laurell Hill about a Mile from said Creek formerly called Hickany Paulin's Creek and about two Miles from Rogers place formerly; including a Run now in Quemahoning Township Bedford County and Surveyed in part ~~for~~ 25<sup>th</sup> February 1774 ~~to~~ 2d May 1776. ~~to~~ James Mc Mullan by Warrant ~~in the Name of Alexander Mc Mullan Junr.~~ ~~25<sup>th</sup> July 1774~~ and Returned, but altered on the 15<sup>th</sup> Day of February 1787 for the purpose of taking in a Vacancy which could not otherwise be got at without great irregularity in the Figure or Draught of the Survey, and as well to Satisfy the above grant to James Mc Mullan. since come to hand.
