



A Draught of A Tract of Land situate on the Waters of Little Fishing Creek Above & Adjoining Land of Hains Harris & Mc Mean in the County of Northumberland, Survey'd in the Year 1774 by Charles Lukens which Appears by his field works in the Hand Writing of Jonathan Lodge, Assistant to said Lukens at the time, & Resurvey'd by me Agreeably to the Old lines on the 21st day of December 1790. for William Hall in Pursuance of his Warrant bearing date the 29th day of November 1774. Containing Three Hundred & Thirty Acres with the Allowance of Six Cent for Roads &c.

It is hereby Certify'd that I am satisfied that Joseph Wallis Esq: made returns into the Surveyor Generals Office of Six Surveys. the said Surveys on Warrants the property of W^m Hall Issued before the Revolution And said to have been Surveyed under the direction of Charles Lukens. - Note also that all the Lands contained in five of those Warrants have been Surveyed by me & returned into the Surveyor Generals office on Warrants of a Subsequent date. And the Warrant in the Name of John Leacock on a Warrant of an earlier date than that in the Name of Leacock.
