



In Pursuance of an Order No 556 dated April the 3^d 1769 was Survey'd on the 18th day of July 1769 by Charles Lukens (the then Deputy Surveyor of that District) on Bald Eagle Creek below and Adjoining Land of Charles Worthington Jun^r then in the County of ~~Bedford~~ Cumberland but now in the County of Northumb'd for Ephraim Gover A Tract of Land Containing two Hundred and Eighty Acres with the Usual Allowance of Six & C^t ~~for~~ &c but as Sundry Persons Claiming orders of A Later date for the Same Land, have Complain'd that the Survey Extended further down the Creek than it had A Right to go, and he having Apply'd to me (by his Assignee) to alter the Same, I have therefore on the 24th day of July 1783 Resurvey'd the Same Agreeable to the Above Draught, Containing three Hundred and fourteen Acres and the Usual Allowance of Six & C^t for Roads &c
