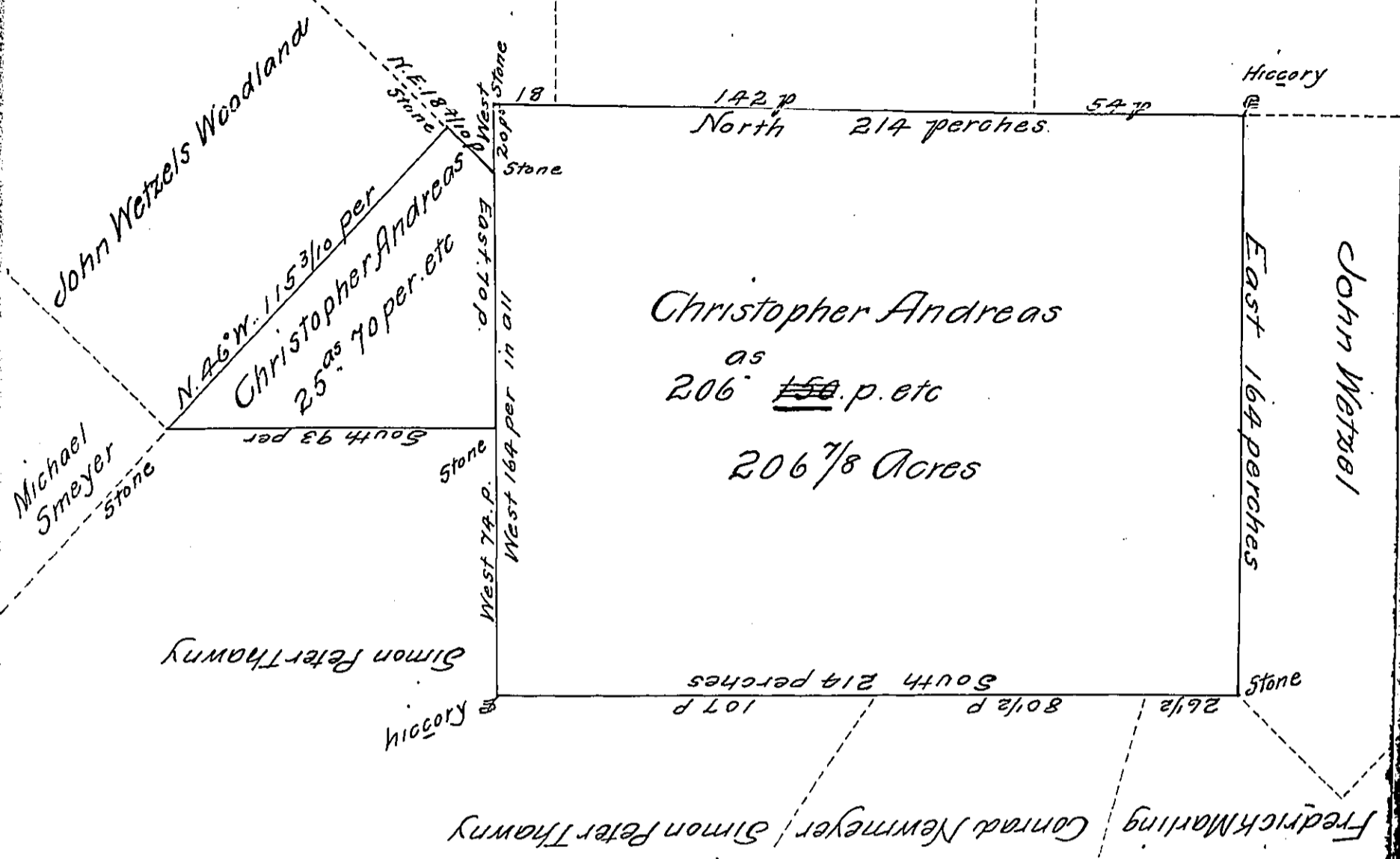

A Draught of Two Tracts of Land, Situate in Upper Milford Township in the County of Northampton in the State of Pennsylvania - The first Tract Containing Two Hundred and six Acres and 140 Perches of Land together with the usual Allowance for Roads, which was formerly improved by Rudolph Andreas who by his Will devised his Right to the Same to his only Son Christopher Andreas, But by what Warrant the Same was Surveyed to him is yet unknown to us - The Second Tract Contains Twenty Five Acres and 70 Perches of Land together with the usual Allowance for Roads, which was Surveyed for the Said Christopher Andreas on the 27th March Anno - 1776 by Virtue of an Order granted to him by the Surveyor General in Pursuance of an Application made by him for the Same - Dated at Philadelphia on the Ninth Day of July Anno - 1766 - No 1720 - Now at the Request of the Said Christopher Andreas the same was Resurveyed for him on the 26th November 1782 -
