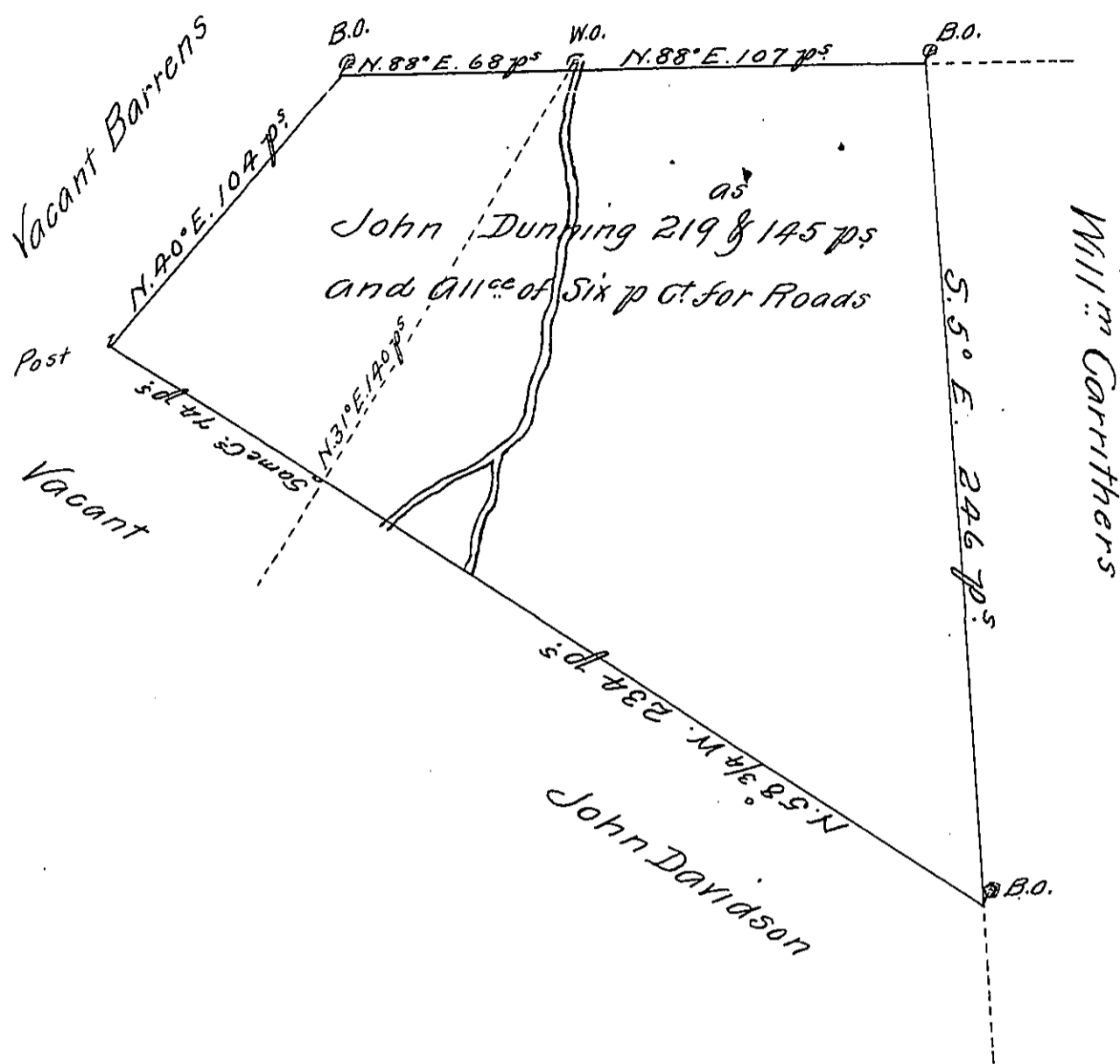


Ezekiel Dunning



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in West Pennsborough Township in Cumberland County Containing two Hundred and nineteen Acres and one Hundred and forty five perches and the Usual allowance of six p Cent for Roads; Surveyed June the nineteenth 1764 for John Dunning in pursuance of two Warrants from the Honourable the Propr^s one of Which was Granted to William Armstrong and Dated April 16th Anno Domini 1743; One Hundred and seventy three Acres of the above Tract with allowance shewed by the prick'd Line in the Draught and being the Largest part, was formerly Survey'd for Robert Dunning by virtue of the above Warrant granted him; Which former Survey^r Thomas Calhoon Claims a right to by virtue of an old Grant said to be in the Name of his Father John Calhoon, The residue being forty six Acres & 13 p^s and allowance represented by the prick'd Line in the Draught and Lying on the N.W. end of the old Tract is now added at the request of the abovesaid John Dunning.
