Note John Vernam had a Survey made by Virtue of a Warr<sup>t</sup> for 50 acres dated 23<sup>d</sup> Febr<sup>y</sup> 1747 & afterwards transferred his right of Land Survey<sup>d</sup> to Jno Elliot & John Huston who divided it between them and this is Jno Elliotts part which I thought better to return in his own name and that he should take out a Warr<sup>t</sup> to accept the Survey & to obl. Hustons part on Vernams Warr<sup>t</sup>
