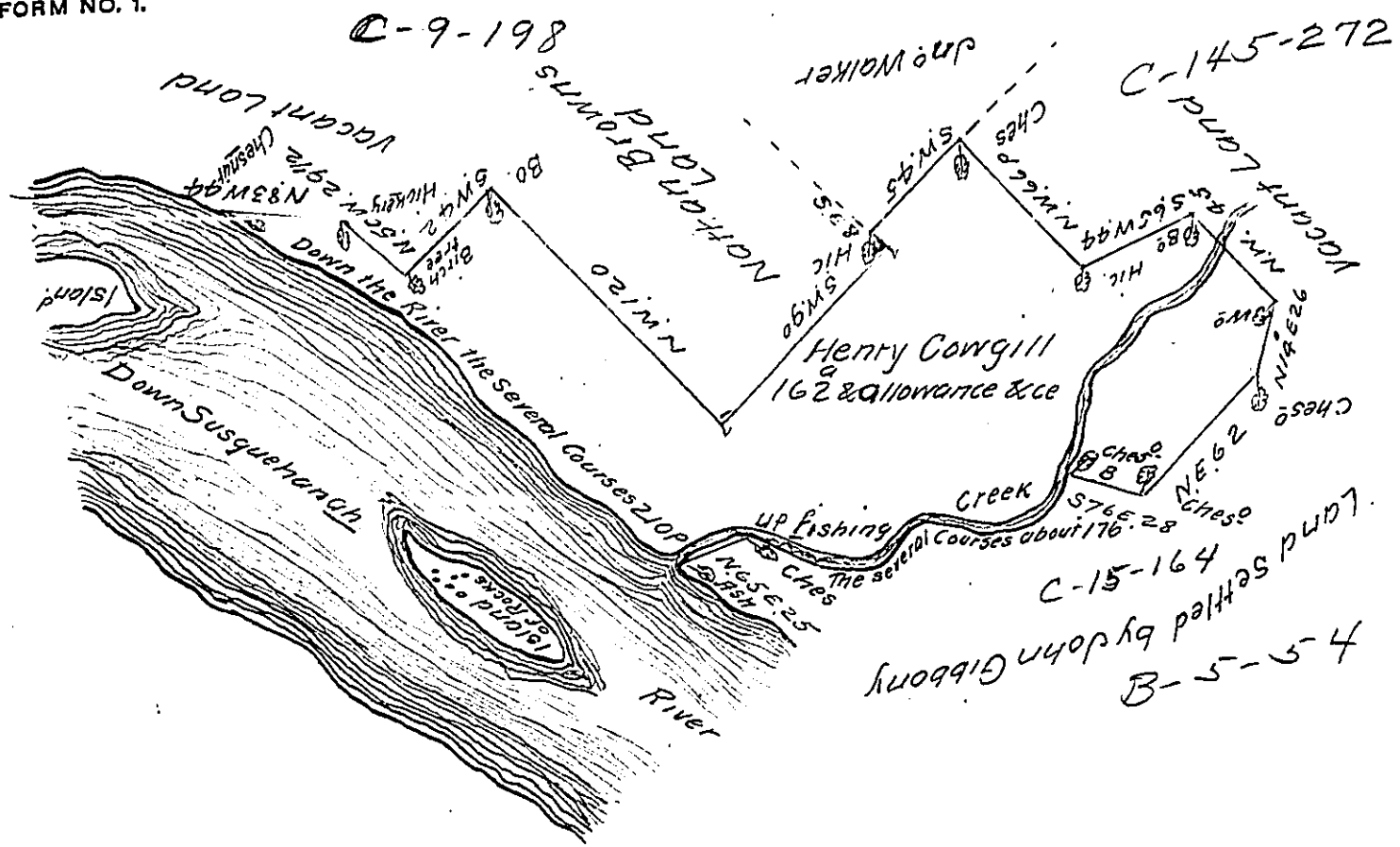


FORM NO. 1.



The above is situate on Fishing Creek & Susquehanna River in Drummore Towne Lancaster County was surveyed the 9th of this instant by warrant of the 18th of March A.D. 1745 & 9th of May last past. The first warrant was taken out in his Brother Eleazer's name the right where of is now convey'd to him the said Henry Cowgill. Beginning at a Chesnut oak (marked B) standing on a laurel bank on y^e south side of Fishing Creek; thence S. 76° E. 28 p to a Chesnut oak; thence N.E. 62 p to another Ches. oak; thence N. 19° E. 26 p to a White oak; thence N.W. 45 p to a Black oak; thence S. 65° W. 44 p to a Hickery; thence N.W. 66 p to a Chesnut in a line of land late belonging to J^{no} Walker; thence by the same S.W. 45 p to a Hickery in Nathan Brown's line; thence S.E. 8 p to his Corner post; thence by his land S.W. 90 to a post & N.W. 12 p to a Black oak; thence S.W. 92 p to a Birch tree; thence N. 50° W. 29 1/2 p to a Hickery; thence N. 83° W. 44 p to a Chesnut on y^e brink of Susquehanna River; thence down the same the several Courses 210 p to an Ash standing one perch on y^e south side of the mouth of Fishing Creek; thence N. 65° E. 25 p to a Chesnut on y^e same side of Fishing Creek; thence up the several Courses thereof about 170 p to the place of Beginning containing 162 acres & the allowance of 6 p Cent. Plotted on a scale of 80 p to an inch this 28th of 9^{ber} 1750
