



A draught of a survey called Hall's Industry situate in Plum Township, Allegheny County on the waters of Thompsons Run, containing Two hundred and forty Acres and allowance of Six & Cent. for Roads &c. Executed November 26th., 1811. in pursuance of a warrant granted to Jacob Hill dated 3^d of Nov^r, 1784 now in Rit. of John Hall.
