



John Robinson's Land at the Mouth of Pequea Creek in Chester County. Beginning at the Lower side of the Mouth of the sd Creek thence Down Susquehanna River South South West 81 perches to a White Oak, thence South East by East by Vacant Land 200 perches to a poplar Tree, then North East by Vacant Land 81 per. to a Hickery, thence N.W. by W. 120 perches to the sd Pequea Creek, Thence Down the same 110 perches to the place of Beginning Containing 100 Acres with the usual Allowance of 6 P.C. Survey'd 16th of 9th 1719.
