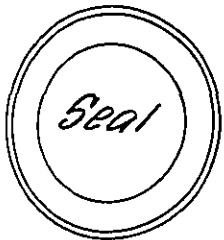


Pennsylvania 55.By the Proprietaries

These are to authorize and require you to survey  
 and lay out for our Use the Quantity of Fifteen  
 Thousand acres of Land on Jacobs Creek about  
 two Miles above Braddocks Road on both sides  
 the Road and Creek and to make Return there-  
 of into our Secretarys Office And for so doing this  
 shall be your sufficient Warrant Witness John  
 Penn Esq: Lieutenant Governor & Commissioner  
 of Property of the said province who by virtue of  
 certain powers from the said proprietaries hath  
 hereunto set his Hand & caused the Seal of the  
 Land Office to be affixed at philadelphia this  
 twenty second Day of February in the Year of  
 our Lord One Thousand seven hundred & sixty nine.
