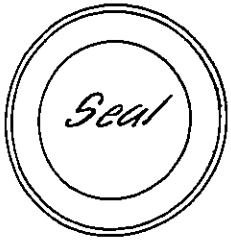


By The Proprietaries -

Pennsylvania ss. Whereas George Croghan of the County of Cumberland hath requested that we would allow him to take up Two hundred Acres of Land near Fort Bedford where Conrad White Miller has erected a saw Mill,



in the said County of Cumberland for which he agrees to pay to our Use, within the Term of Six Months from the Date hereof, at the rate of Fifteen Pounds Ten Shillings, current Money of this Province, for every Hundred Acres; and also to pay the yearly Quit-rent of One Halfpenny Sterling for every Acre thereof, to us, our Heirs and Assigns for ever: These are therefore to authorize and require you to survey or cause to be surveyed, unto the said George Croghan at the place aforesaid, according to the Method of Townships appointed, the said Quantity of Two hundred Acres, if not already surveyed or appropriated, and make Return thereof into the Secretary's Office, in order for Confirmation; for which this shall be your sufficient Warrant: Which Warrant and survey, in case the said George Croghan fulfil the above Agreement within Six Months from the Date hereof, shall be valid, otherwise void.
