



Surveyed on the Eleventh Day of March 1733 to Michael Lutes a Tract of Land situate on a branch of Perkiomie in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a white oak being a corner of Margaret Shippens land thence by the same North West one hundred fifty six Perches to a hickery Saplin thence by land of Ulrick Englehort South West one hundred & seventy Perches to a post in the line of William and Joseph Haynes's land thence by the same South fifty Degrees East one hundred & fifty six perches to a post thence by Vacant Land North East one hundred & fifty Seven perches to the place of Beginning containing one hundred & fifty Acres with Usual Allowance
