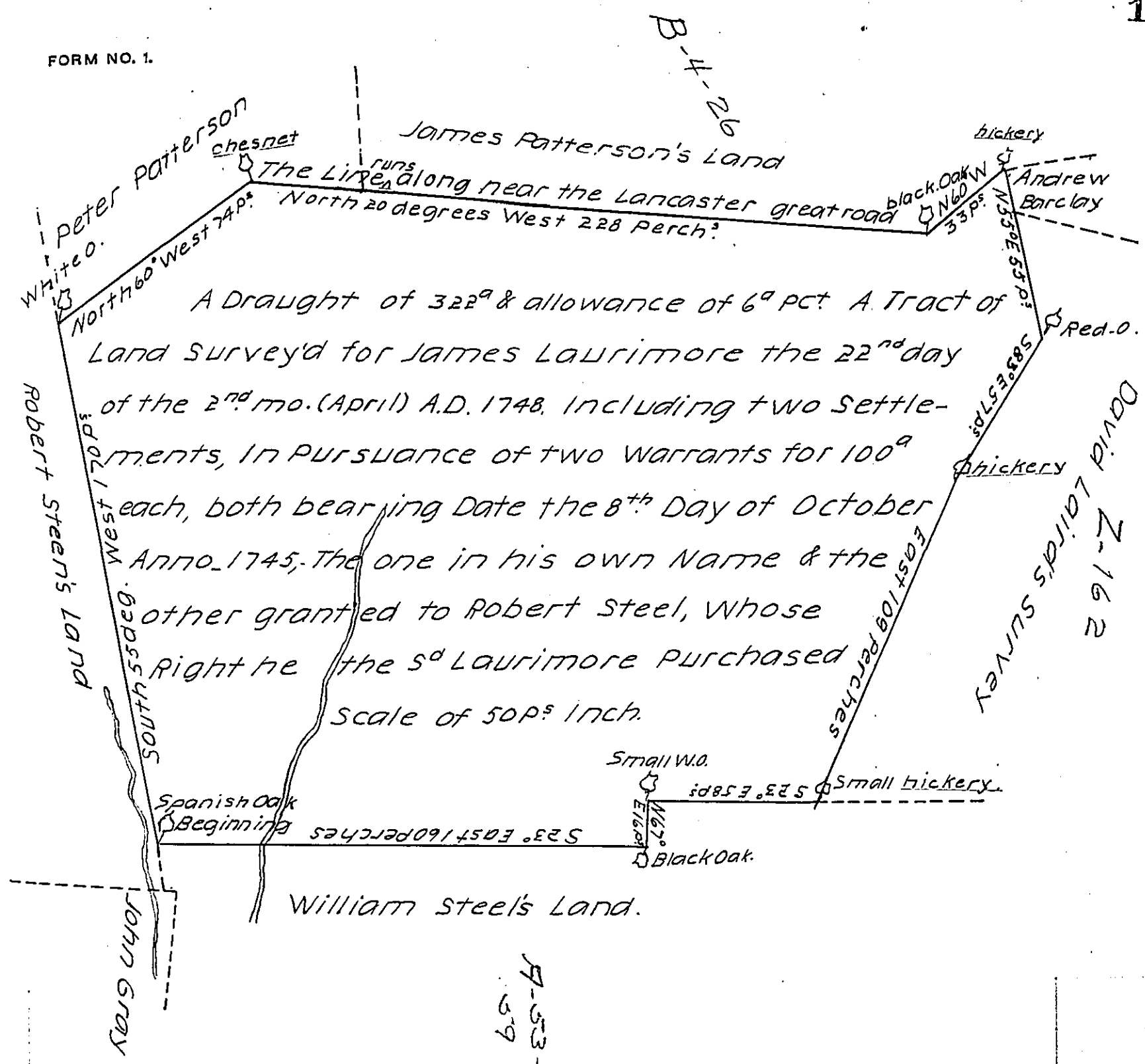


FORM NO. 1.



A Draught of 322<sup>a</sup> & allowance of 6<sup>a</sup> pct. A Tract of Land Survey'd for James Laurimore the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of the 2<sup>nd</sup> mo. (April) A.D. 1748. Including two Settlements, in Pursuance of two Warrants for 100<sup>a</sup> each, both bearing Date the 8<sup>th</sup> Day of October Anno 1745. The one in his own Name & the other granted to Robert Steel, whose Right he the 5<sup>o</sup> Laurimore Purchased Scale of 50 P<sup>s</sup> Inch.

Situate on Water descending into the Western Branch of Octoraro Creek; northward<sup>of</sup> & adjoining to a Place called Scotland in Drummors Township Lancaster County, Beginning at a Marked Spanish Oak Corner of William Steel's Land & Runs thence by Land of Robert Steen South 55 deg. West 170 P to a white oak &c<sup>a</sup> as P the above Draught
