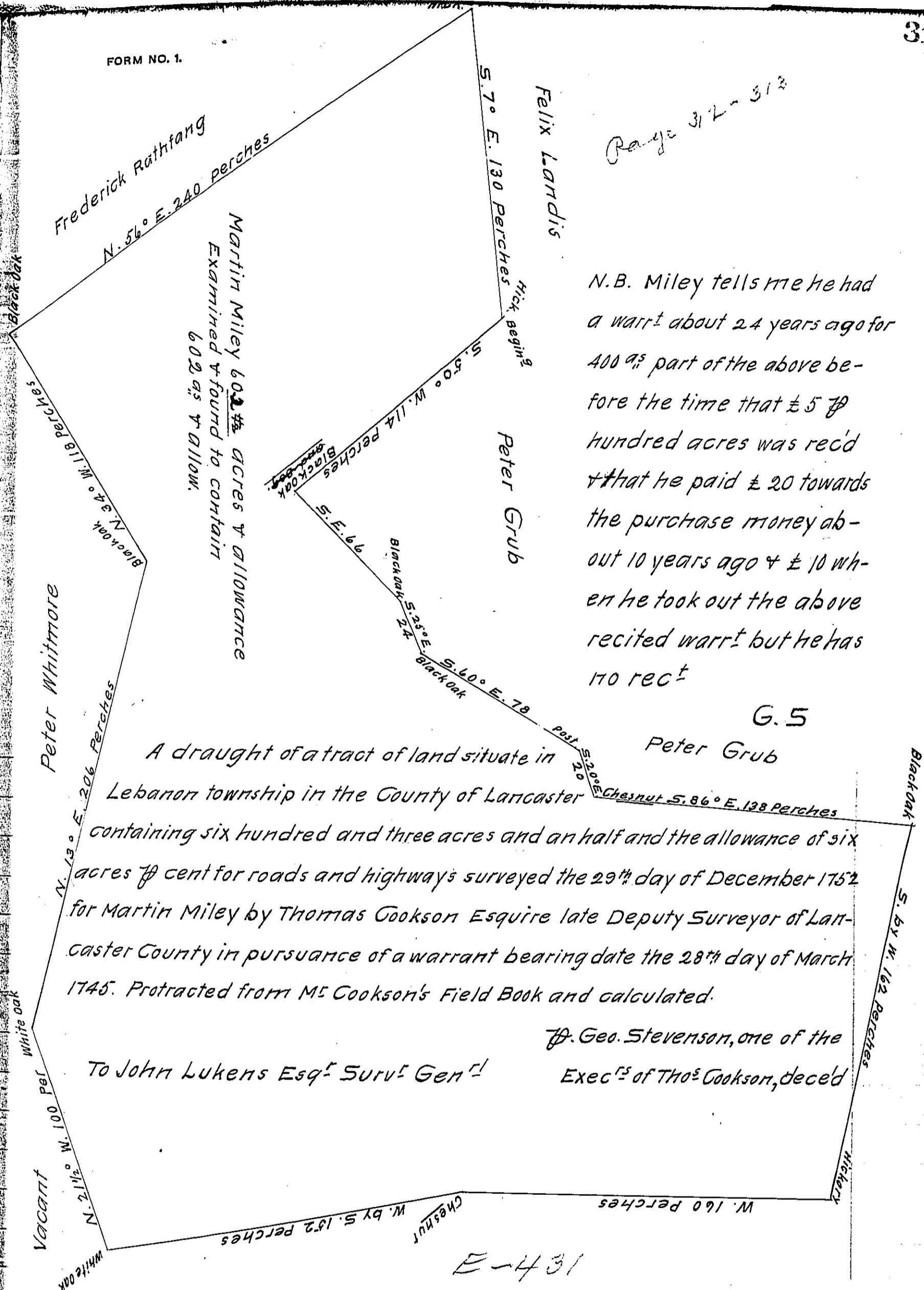

A draught of a tract of land situate in Lebanon township in the County of Lancaster containing six hundred and three acres and an half and the allowance of six acres $\frac{1}{2}$ cent for roads and highways surveyed the 29th day of December 1752 for Martin Miley by Thomas Cookson Esquire late Deputy Surveyor of Lancaster County in pursuance of a warrant bearing date the 28th day of March 1745. Protracted from M^s Cookson's Field Book and calculated.
