A draught of a tract of land called \_\_\_\_\_ situate on the southerly side of the East Branch of Susquehanna River adjoining land of Jesse Lukens and James Parr in Augusta township North<sup>d</sup> County containing one hundred and fifty seven acres and a half acre besides the usual allowance of six  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent for roads &c. Surveyed the 10<sup>th</sup> day of June 1774 for James McCay in pursuance of a warrant dated the 7<sup>th</sup> day of April 1774
