



The above is a draught of a tract of land lying upon the waters of Mill Creek Washington County containing 400 acres surveyed by virtue of a Virginia certificate in these words viz:

We the Commissioners appointed to adjust the claims to unpatented lands in the Counties of Monongalia, Yohogania & Ohio do hereby certify that Joseph McCreedy is entitled to four hundred acres of land in the County of Yohogania on the waters of Mill Creek to include his settlement made in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and seventy six. Given under our hands at Coxes Fort this eighteenth day of Feb<sup>r</sup> 1780. in the fourth year of the Commonwealth. Ent<sup>d</sup> 25<sup>th</sup> April 1780 in ye name of Jos<sup>s</sup> McGrady Ret<sup>d</sup> 7. Sept. 1785. Surveyed June 25<sup>th</sup> 1785 for Joseph McCreedy.
