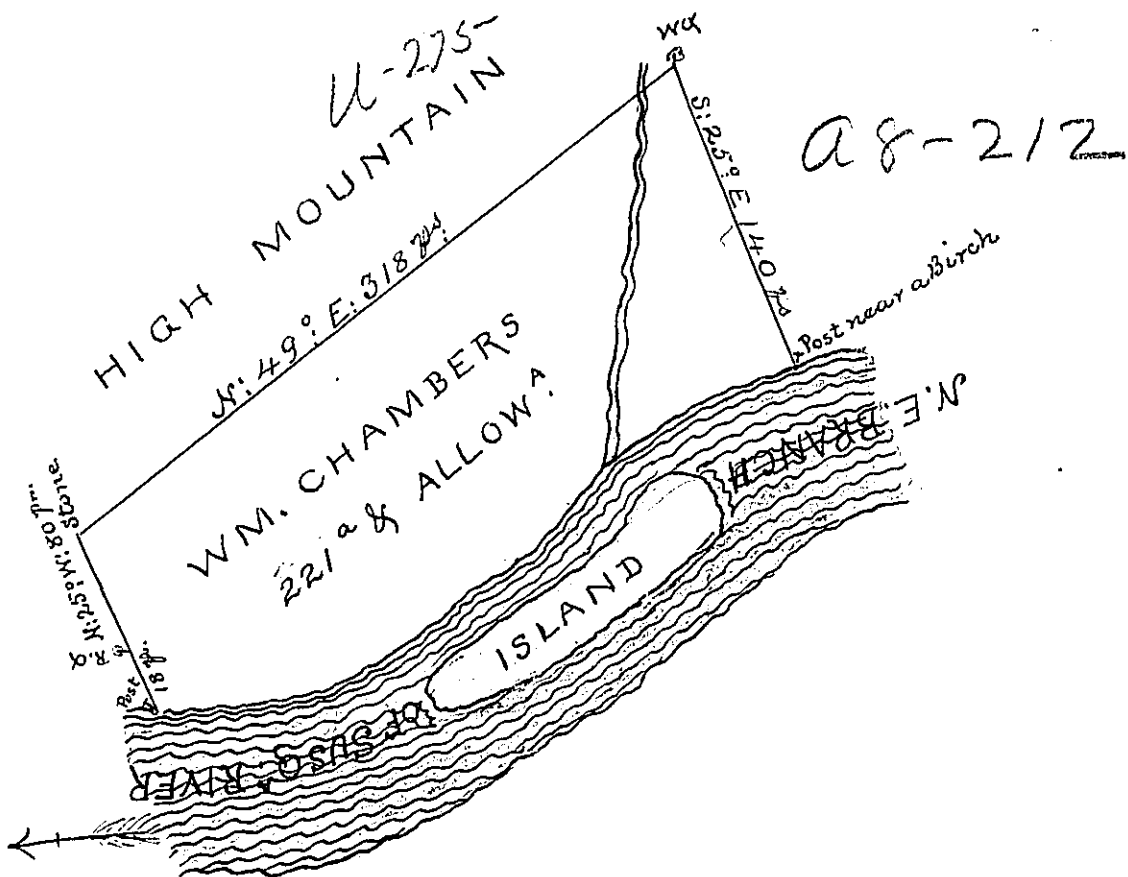


SCALE 100 PERCHES TO AN INCH
