
situate North

Beginning at a Corner marked Black Oak, <sup>standing near a obliq<sup>ue</sup> of North East</sup> thence East by Vacant Land Two hundred & Sixty-eight perches to a Black Oak, thence North by West, by Vacant Land Two hundred & Sixty perches to a Post, thence West by Vacant Land Two hundred & Sixty-eight perches to a White Oak, thence South by Vacant Land Two hundred & Sixty perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Beginning. Containing Four hundred acres with y<sup>e</sup> allowance of Six per cent.

Survey'd and layd out by the General Surveyors Order the 19<sup>th</sup> day of April 1716.
