

By virtue of a Warrant from the Honourable Proprietaries bearing Date the 15th Day of February anno Dom. 1737 I have Surveyed and laid out unto Benjamin Chambers in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster, on the West side Susquehanna River, Five Hundred and Twenty three Acres of Land with allowance of 6 P. Acre, Beginning at a White Oak Standing on the side of Conestoga Creek, Thence North eighteen Degrees Eastwards One hundred and Sixty paces to a white Oak, Thence North Thirteen Degrees Eastwards Two hundred paces to a Black Oak, Thence South Sixty five degrees Eastwards Two hundred and Sixty paces to a white Oak, Thence South Twenty five Degrees Westwards Three hundred paces to a Hickory, Thence North Sixty five Degrees Westwards one hundred and Eighty paces to a Hickory, Thence South Twenty four degrees Westwards twenty paces to a Black Oak, Thence South eight degrees and a half Westwards Sixty paces to a white Oak, thence North eighty degrees Westwards forty four paces to a Red Cedar by the S. Creek, thence down the same crossing over the Creek and about forty paces west to the place of Beginning.
