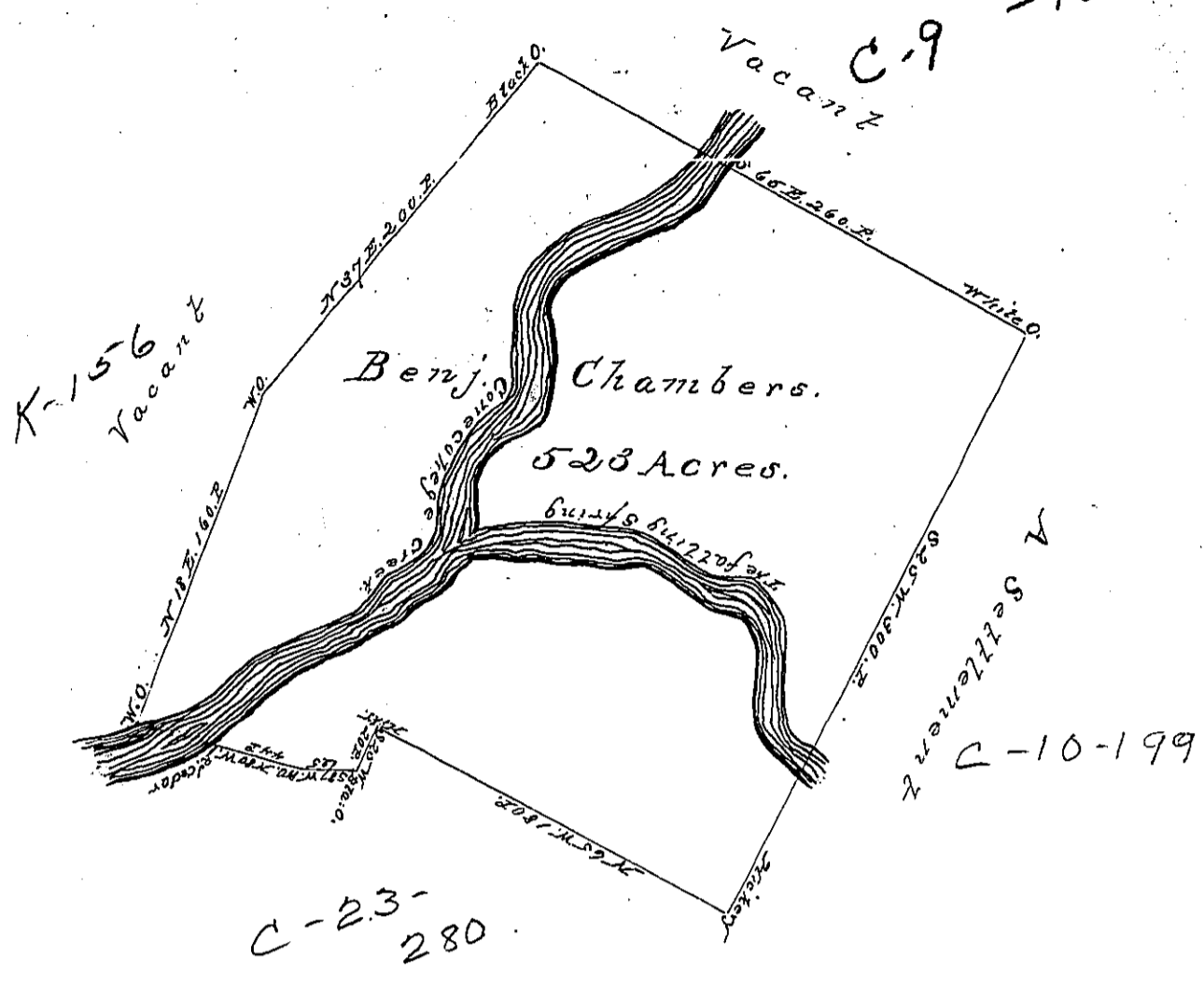

By virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the 15th Day of February Anno Dom. 1737. I have Survey'd and laid out unto Benjamin Chambers in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster, on the West side Susquehanna River, Five Hundred and Twenty three Acres of Land with allowance of 6 s. cent; Beginning a White Oak Standing on the side of Connechege Creek. Thence North eighteen Degree Castely One hundred and Sixty perches to a white Oak, Thence North Thirteen Degree Castely Two hundred perches to a Black Oak, Thence South sixty five degree Castely Two hundred and sixty perches to a white Oak. Thence South Twenty five Degree Westely Three hundred perches to a Hickery, Thence North Sixty five Degree Westely one hundred and eighty perches to a Hickery Thence South twenty five degree Westely twenty perches to a Black Oak Thence South eight seven degree Westely Twenty six perches to a white Oak, thence north eighty degree Westely forty perches to a Red Cedar by the S^d Creek, thence down the bank crossing over the Creek was about forty perches to the place of Beginning, To Wm^o Chestnut Survey^r Genl. Survey^r Jas^o Salk. Butcher D^y.
