



A Draught of a Tract of Land. Situate in the Eastern District of the Oley Hills, in the County of Berks and Province of Pennsylvania. Being part of a Tract, 109<sup>ac</sup> 20<sup>per</sup> of Land and allowances Belonging to Peter Kable, formerly Surveyed to John Wiser, by Warrant of the 27<sup>th</sup> June 1751. The said Peter Kable Sold the above Part thereof unto Abraham Bechtel.

Beginning at a stone, a Corner of William Mayburg's or Tacaut Land, thence by the same, North 60<sup>deg</sup> West 32 perches to a Stone set for a Corner of the said Peter Kable's Land, thence by the same North 44 degrees East 168 perches to a stone, thence by Land of John Eigner Late Jacob Finkbonner South 88<sup>deg</sup> 53<sup>min</sup> East 37 1/2 perches to a stone in the line of the said Abraham Bechtel's other Land. Thence by the same South 40<sup>deg</sup> West 186 perches to the Place of Beginning.

Containing Thirty one Acres and 90 Perches of Land, together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads, or Thirty three Acres and 72 Perches including the allowance. Surveyed for the said Abraham Bechtel on the 25<sup>th</sup> March Anno 1766.
